In the event a candidate has no contributions or expenditures during a reporting period, a financial statement which states there were no contributions received or expenditures made must still be filed. Utah Code Ann. § 10-3-208(3)(b-d)

A person is considered a candidate and must begin filing financial disclosure reports if one or more of the following occurs:

- The individual files a declaration of candidacy; or
- The individual receives contributions or makes expenditures related to candidacy for office or gives consent for any other person to receive contributions or make expenditures to bring about the person's nomination or election to a municipal office.

Utah Code Ann. § 10-3-208(1)(c)

Every candidate or entity is required to have a separate bank account for campaign funds and may not mingle with personal accounts. Utah Code Ann. § 10-3-208(3)(a)

Penalties for Failure to File Timely Disclosure

If a Candidate fails to file a required campaign finance disclosure statement before the municipal primary election and/or the municipal general election by the specified deadlines, the City Recorder is required to inform the appropriate election official who shall, if practicable, remove the candidate's name from the ballot by blacking out the candidate's name before the ballots are delivered to the voters. If removing the candidate's name from the ballot is not practicable, the election official shall inform the voters by any practicable method that the candidate has been disqualified and that votes cast for the candidate will not be counted. If a timely disclosure form is filed but contains inadvertent omission or insignificant errors, a candidate may remain eligible for the ballot. Utah Code Ann. § 10-3-208 (9).
